Installation of Elevators at TTC's St. Andrew Station University Avenue and King Street West

Start Date: Late-April 2010
End Date: Spring 2011

Timeline is subject to change due to unforeseen events.

Beginning in late-April 2010, the Toronto Transit Commission will begin work to retrofit the St. Andrew subway station with two elevators. Work is scheduled for completion in spring 2011.

Work Hours - Night Work at Street Level

While the majority of the work will be conducted within the station, periodically during the early stages and the latter stages of the project, work will be undertaken at street level in the southbound traffic lanes of University Avenue, just north of King Street. The work at street level will require lane reductions on University Avenue and will therefore be confined to weeknights from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m., and on weekends from 11 p.m. Friday through to 6 a.m. Monday. Efforts will be made to schedule noisier work on weekends. ***Update notices relating to the night work at street level will be provided in advance.***

Traffic Restrictions

During some weeknights and some weekends, University Avenue will be temporarily reduced to one southbound lane and two northbound lanes between Adelaide Street and King Street to accommodate construction of an underground elevator shaft. The lanes will be fully reinstated by 6 a.m. on weekdays.

Pedestrian Access

The west sidewalk on University Avenue will be maintained at a narrower width due to the contractor's compound being located on the west side of University Avenue north of King Street. The east sidewalk adjacent to the glass pavilion structure at 145 King Street West will be secured off, but a temporary alternate accessible pedestrian route will be provided. The entrance to the pavilion will be maintained during the working hours of 145 King Street West.

Station Access and Transit Service

St. Andrew Station will remain accessible and operational during construction. Work at street level will not affect 504 King streetcar service. All work areas will be separated from public areas with proper partitions and barriers.
